Research Grants Spring 2017

The Council of the Lawrence Henry Gipson Institute for Eighteenth-Century Studies offers research grants in eighteenth-century studies for undergraduates, graduate students, and faculty. The Institute is interdisciplinary; these grants apply to any study that falls largely in the years 1700-1800, in any discipline or program.

Faculty and graduate students are eligible for research grants up to \$2,500. Areas of support are research travel, photo duplication, special materials and equipment; per diems for food and lodging must be consistent with Lehigh guidelines.

Deadline for proposals is Friday, February 24, 2017

Applications should include:

1. **Proposal narrative:** a concise, specific description of the research project (one to two pages, single-spaced).
2. **Budget:** detailed itemized budget statement, including (if applicable) specific repositories where research will be conducted. Budgets should include estimates for each cost: travel, per diem food and lodging, photocopying, admissions, etc. The costs must be justified in the proposal narrative.
3. **Faculty endorsement** for graduate student applications.

Faculty and Graduate Students Travel to Conferences. Small grants (a maximum of \$250) are available to assist Lehigh graduate students to attend a professional conference. Grants (a maximum of \$500) are available to assist Lehigh graduate students who present a paper at a professional conference. The graduate student's studies should focus on the eighteenth century, in any discipline. Small grants are also available for faculty presenting a paper in a relevant topic; these faculty grants are only available after department funds have been exhausted. No deadlines: applications may be submitted to the Office of Interdisciplinary Programs, (see above).

Undergraduate or graduate student research grants up to \$200 for travel, copying, admission fees, etc. Contact Professor Michelle LeMaster for an application form. The faculty member supervising the research must approve the application. No deadlines: applications may be submitted to the Office of Interdisciplinary Programs, (see above).

Curriculum support for activities related to the eighteenth century in undergraduate classes. Maximum grant: \$200. Grants will be approved for field trips, speakers, admissions to museums, etc., and curricular materials. No deadlines: detailed requests may be submitted to the Office of Interdisciplinary Programs, (see above).
