DISSERTATION FELLOWSHIP

The Council of the Gipson Institute invites PhD students enrolled at Lehigh University who are working on dissertations in eighteenth-century studies to apply for a one-year fellowship to support dissertation research and writing. The recipient will receive a stipend of **\$25,500**. Preference will be given to candidates who expect to complete their dissertations during the fellowship year. The dissertation may be in any field of eighteenth century studies, but should focus substantially on that time period.

Applications should include a curriculum vitae and a three-to-five page statement of purpose describing your project, the progress you have made to date, and specific plans for completing the project during the fellowship period. A letter of recommendation should be submitted separately by your dissertation advisor.

The recipient will be expected to participate in Gipson Institute activities, file a brief final report indicating progress made in the project, and, when feasible, offer an informal presentation on the project to interested faculty and students. The recipient is expected to work on his or her dissertation full-time during the academic year.

The Gipson Council expects to offer the dissertation fellowship on an annual basis.
